### PERSONALISATION OF GOLF CLUBS

Over the last 10 years of me teaching this fine sport that we call golf it has always astounded me that golfers go out and spend hundreds and thousands of pounds on the latest irons and woods. Whether it's because they have read about them in a magazine or they just want to look good when they turn up on the tee of a weekend. Either way it's a bad way of buying a set of clubs. What a lot of golfers don't realise is that the clubs may not be suitable for them.

For example the standard set of clubs you see on the shelf at your local pro-shop are normally geared up for a gent that has a height of 5 ft 8 inches and for a lady 5 ft 5 inches. Now we all know that we are not all the average height so what you should do first is to ask if it is possible be to measured up for the clubs you will hopefully be buying. Ask the pro to check the lie of the club is correct, whether it needs to be made more up-right or made flatter, check the length of the shaft, it may need to be made longer or shorter than standard and finally check the grip size.

All these points need to be thought of when you buy your next set of golf clubs because if they're not the right lie or length then no matter how good you are you will not play good consistent golf.
