The opportunity is there to see Mountain Goats, Eagles, and even Bear and Moose on your flights. Young or old, all will be amazed by the pristine beauty found on the beautiful Kenai Peninsula.

Most operators provide outdoor and rain gear but take your own gloves, hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, and comfortable clothing. The operators normally provide Ski equipment.

Tours are normally available from June through September, and if you get that far, why not check out the cruise activity. You can tour Resurrection Bay and its outside waters looking for the abundant Humpback whales, Orcas and porpoise. But be on the lookout for the occasional Finback, Grey, and Minke whales.

The main focus of many of these trips is to spend time with the whales, but you'll also see the sea lions, sea otters, and an abundance of other marine wildlife.

If bears are your thing, A float plane trip to the Anan Creek Bear Observatory is the best way to see bears in their natural habitat. This tour includes a 40 minute flight each way, and then a 1/2 mile walk up a trail to the Observatory deck. You'll spend 1.5 hours watching both black & brown bear fishing for the salmon making their way upstream. Anan Creek is staffed by the US Forest Service and they limit the number of people that come into Anan each year, so book in advance for receiving the permits for this tour.

Make your way to Traitor's Cove and another tour will allow you to watch black bear feeding on the salmon that are fighting their way up stream to spawn.

It's all on the internet, just search for Alaska.

Most of all...DON'T FORGET THE CAMERA! As this is a trip of a life time, if you are willing to step outside the box, just go for something different and enjoy a vacation that is like nothing you will have done before, you'll have a great time.
