Stuart's replacement in the management role is Lynn Waring who many of you will know is married to RGBB member David Waring. See

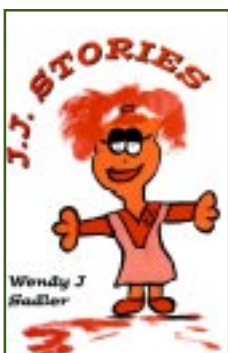

There is something so magical and special about being able to put words together that mean something to some-one else. The ability of journalists to move you off your comfortable sofa and scratch around for donations to a cause that you had not heard of until two seconds before, never fails to amaze me.

I have always loved words and seven years ago I was given the opportunity to put down what I felt on paper. It was then that I created my children's stories - J.J., named after our daughter Jacqueline Jayne. It was also around this time that I began to write a novel. I never, ever thought that I would reach the stage where I could write more than ten pages, let alone a hundred.

The one person, who should have believed in me, didn't. I didn't believe that I could do it. I didn't believe that my work was good enough. I didn't believe that some-one would want to publish my books. But two people did believe in me, my father and my husband, Stuart. It is because of what these two saw in my work that I finally had the courage to put seven years of hard work to the test and submit first my children's stories and then my novel, A FATHER'S LOVE for publication. Both were accepted and published. My children's book J.J. STORIES has been on sale since August 2005, and my novel goes



on sale at the end of November 2005.

So if you want to know the secret goings on involved in Embassy life as well as the life of one MI6 agent in Moscow, A FATHER'S LOVE is the book for you. Keep a look out for my next novel which follows the lead characters into the deserts of Saudi Arabia with a rather nasty British Ambassador set on destruction! Could he be a double agent?
